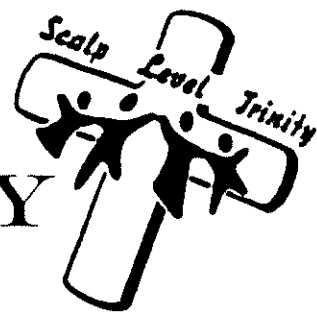

The team will leave the first week in July.

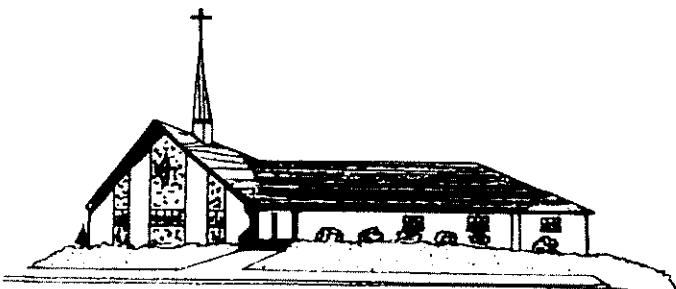

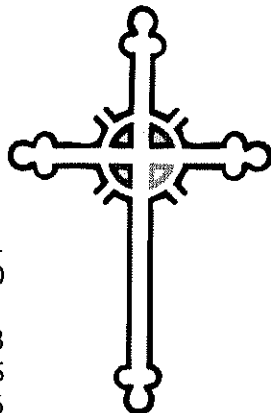
